## **Laura Allard Future Vision Scholarship**

Please provide a personal statement (maximum of 500 words) describing the following:

- Your area(s) of outstanding academic achievement
- Your plan for future studies involving this academic discipline(s) at the university level
- Your long-term aspirations and goals in this area(s)

Applicants must submit three (3), and only three, exhibits associated with the different eligibility criteria below to provide evidence of exemplary achievement. Use separate exhibit cover pages for each exhibit submission (cover page templates found at https://www.txgifted.org/scholarships). For non-print artifacts, you may represent these with a photo image taken with a camera or downloaded from a website or create a representation using other digital media. It may be constructive to consult with a teacher, counselor or another educational advocate/mentor who can help you to identify and craft your exhibits. Students are permitted to submit three exhibits from the same category, but are encouraged to submit different exhibit types to display various accomplishments and abilities. Exceptional test score. Be identified as highly gifted as evidenced by nationally standardized intelligence or achievement test scores: comprehensive or subtest score. Scored in top 5% on standardized test scores within the last three years. Accelerated. Be grade or content area accelerated by at least one

year. One referral letter should provide evidence of acceleration within content of letter. Exemplary achievement. Provide evidence of exceptional accomplishment, i.e., received a distinguishing award, scholarship, won competition generally received/earned by a person 1 or more years older than nominee. Provide copy or scan of award letter with statement attached explaining the exemplary achievement. Early Entrance or Dual Enrollment. Entered high school by age 13 or younger OR college by age 15 or younger. Exemplary School Work. Provide a sample of work (DVD or video link) that sets this student/applicant apart from his/her peers in a specific gifted category or content area discipline. Attach a statement explaining the exemplary school work. Competition Winner. Won state, regional, national or international status in an academic or arts competition (e.g., chess, science, mathematics, arts, leadership, forensics, engineering). Provide copy of award letter or other evidence, along with a statement explaining the significance of the competition.

Upload one, and only one, letter of recommendation from an educator who taught you in high school (maximum of 500 words). If preferred, recommendations can be emailed to TAGT directly to membership@txgifted.org.

Upload one, and only one, letter of recommendation from another adult (not a family member) (maximum of 500 words). If preferred, recommendations can be emailed to TAGT directly at **membership@txgifted.org**.

Please provide an adult recommendation from an adult who is not the parent. A strong recommendation of a student will focus on the strengths of the applicant. Include examples, if possible.
